## **RINGER CARDS & AWARDS**

**Ringers:** At the Founders, Members, Players and Reserve courses, LGA conducts a "Ringers" competition for the golf season (generally from December through November 30). Each LGA member is automatically entered in the Ringer competition by completing a Ringer Card.

The object of the Ringer competition is to make the best score possible on each hole over the length of the LGA season. Here's how Ringer Cards work:

The first time you play the Founders, Members, Players or Reserve courses, you will post the hole-by-hole gross scores on your Ringer Card by circling the score you made on each hole. Pencil must be used in case of errors. Subsequent scores are circled on the card only when you <u>improve your score on any hole</u>. Please make sure that you take the time to accurately record scores on the Ringer Card (i.e., marking the correct course and holes).

Ringer cards are located in the LGA Ringer file and are available each play day. You may count any score on a hole as a Ringer as long as the following occurs:

- You play each shot on the hole "putts within leather" will count.
- To count an official "birdie or eagle", it must be holed out.
- You complete the 18-hole round and a score is posted.
- A score on any individual hole recorded as an "X" will not be used. (At the end of the year, if the final score is "X" it will be counted as 10).

**Birdies, Eagles and Holes-in-One:** Each member is responsible for recording gross birdies, eagles and holes-in-one on the back of the Ringer Card. These will be recognized on the "Birdie Tree" in the Members Club lower-level hallway. Hole-in-One names will be placed on an LGA Plaque.

Prizes are awarded for Ringers, Birdies, Eagles and Holes-in-One and are presented at the Holiday Par-Tee in December.

**Most Improved Player:** This award will be given annually to the Most Improved Player in the LGA based on the USGA recommended formula calculated by the Pro Shop.
